We are going to move what we believe we need, to the reserve center this month. Sunday we will take some cadets and some officers and assign them to gather stuff and move it to the reserve center in preparations for our return to our winter home.

October, we will drill at Genesse County Park. We have been asked to volunteer to help with the Acorn Run as we have every year for as long as I can remember. This year we ALL will volunteer and we will drill out at the park. This means we will arrive Saturday morning, drill as a unit, then help setup for the Acorn run with park staff. Once that is complete, we will again drill. Overnight is usually some sort of night OPS setup by our Operations Department. Sunday morning, we

will help with the Acorn Run and then take down anything the park staff wishes us to help with. Please make sure you have arrangements for a ride out to the park and home thee next day. Be sure to plan accordingly to arrive on time and be picked up on time. If transportation will be an issue send that up the chain ASAP. We can only help with transportation if we know about it early enough. The drill dates are 05-06OCT2024.

November drill we will report to the reserve center. So, this means this September drill is our last drill aboard the ships this year. The Christmas banquet is also being talked about. Yes, I said Christmas. We need to plan on baskets, tickets, and items of food to bring to the banquet. As of this writing the banquet will be held 07DEC2024, but that date has not been confirmed yet. The location is still be finalized as of this writing as well. We hope to have a solid answer on both the location and day for September drill. Please start thinking about what you will provide for a basket, and dish for the banquet.

One last thing item of preparedness. Look at your dress blues. Put them on, check them out, get a list together as to what you need. If you were never issued dress blues, put in a chit for your blues. If something does not fit put in a chit. We will issue all dress blues items at November drill, but if you get a chit in the system during September, Supply will be better prepared for you come November.

Keep on doing that coursework, PT, and testing for promotions.

\*Meals are \$5.00 PER MEAL.\*

Additionally, Cadets are required to have a canteen for hydration. It is part of your uniform. If you do not have one, you will be REQUIRED to purchase a bottle of water from the unit for \$2.00. You will use it for the entire weekend, refilling it as needed. If you lose it or throw it out, you will be required to purchase another one.

#### \*\*\*ATTENTION ALL CADETS\*\*\*

Be advised, it is recommended that you bring your ribbon rack to drill every month. It should be kept in some sort of safe "packaging" to make sure you don't lose any ribbons in transport. A ziploc bag should work fine. Make sure it is CLEARLY & NEATLY labeled with your name. That way, if you receive a ribbon at drill, you can put it right in the bag with the rest of them and not risk losing it between drills. It will also ensure that you always have your rack to turn in if you need to exchange it, so you don't have to pay for a new one.

Any Officer who would like to have their bar checked is also encouraged to bring theirs to the Awards and Ribbons Officer at any time..

- -Black crew-length socks (at least 2 pair)
- -Unit PT Gear...if you are new and have not received a set yet, you will need to wear a PLAIN yellow OR Navy Blue t-shirt and Navy Blue or Black shorts...(shorts

should fit loosely & appropriately and be at least knee length or *slightly* above.)

- -Sneakers
- -White crew-length socks (at least 2 pair)
- -Undergarments (at least 2)
- -Sweatsuit or shorts & t-shirt to sleep in
- -Pillow
- -Sleeping bag or blanket
- -Shower shoes (flip flops)
- -Hygiene products (**DEODORANT**, soap/shampoo, toothbrush/toothpaste, etc.)
- -Towel
- -Brush/comb as necessary

- -Hair products (hairbands/bobby-pins/hairspray as necessary)
- -Canteen/Canteen Belt (Camelbacks approved for PO3 and above)
- -APPROPRIATE SWIMSUITS.

#### -September *is* an overnight drill.

- -Reminder: EVERY email that includes an officer as a recipient, MUST include a second officer. This is not just a unit regulation, it is a full program regulation set forth by National Headquarters. Please note: even though it's "in the name", a Petty Officer does *NOT* count as an Officer; the regulation is in regards to ADULT Officers.
- -If you are unsure of how to "copy/cc" someone to an email, ask someone for help. It is imperative that this regulation be followed. Please use "cc", NOT "bcc".
- -When you are sending an email to an officer, be sure to acknowledge WHO the email is directed at. Since you are required to include a second officer on emails, you need to make sure that the recipients are aware of who the email is actually directed at. Beginning an email without specifying who it is directed at is confusing to the recipients as well as disrespectful.
- -For new cadets (and anyone else not sure)... **REMEMBER**: if you need to ask a question, make a request, share information, etc with an adult officer, you **NEED TO GO THROUGH YOUR CHAIN OF COMMAND**. That being said, any Cadet who is not in a leadership position should be calling or emailing their ACC (or CC if your company does

not have an ACC) to begin the chain. You do not contact senior leadership directly, especially the CO and XO.

Currently, the CC for League Cadets is LCPO3 N. Wadman.

The ACC for RTC is SR Rivas-Contreras. The CC for RTC is SN Eiser. The CC for ATC & LPO is PO2 K. Wadman. Those cadets will continue the chain until it reaches the appropriate recipient and the issue will be resolved as necessary. Additionally, ACC's, CC's, LPO, CPO: you need to be checking your cadet email daily; you are in leadership positions and if your cadets are reaching out to senior leadership, YOU need to make sure it gets passed up.

Parents and Cadets,


